Key Knowledge:

To know that...

- **Christians believe Jesus challenges everyone about how to live — He sets the example for loving God and your neighbour, putting others first.**
- **Jesus shows love and forgiveness to unlikely people.**
- **Christians try to be like Jesus —they want to know Him better and better.**
- Christians try to put his teaching and example into practice in lots of ways, from church worship to social justice.
- Matthew 4:18–22 is part of a ‘Gospel’, which tells the story of the life and teaching of Jesus.
- Following Jesus and being fishers of people are actions that Jesus wanted people to do, which is why many Christians today still try to do them.
- The actions of Jesus towards the leper has meaning for a Christian, particularly the importance of showing love to all.



Key Vocabulary:

Gospel — good news

Testament — one of the two main parts of the Bible, the Old Testament or the New Testament.

Samaritan — a person who is generous in helping those in distress.



Leper — a person who has leprosy.

Gratitude — is the desire to give what you have to others.

Disciples— a disciple is a follower of Jesus.

Clergy — the group of people who have the authority to lead religious services, such as ministers.



Minister — a person authorized to perform or help at the religious services of some religions.

Sin — a person who has broken a religious or moral law.

Sinner — a person who sins.
