Key Knowledge:

To know that:

- ⇒ The Romans fought against the Celts in Britain and then ruled over the tribes that were left.
- ▷ The Roman Empire expanded across most of modern Europe and Northern Africa. They overthrew the Greek Empire.
- ▷ The Romans brought many things to Britain that we still use today like roads, calendar, laws, concrete, aqueducts and central heating.
- ▷ The Romans invaded Britain 3 times and were successful on the third time (43AD).
- ▷ The Roman Era in Britain lasted from 43AD to 410AD.
- ▷ The Roman leaders collected money through taxes.
- ▷ The effective organisation and structure of the Roman army enabled the Roman Empire to expand.
- ▷ The Romans built Hadrian's Wall to keep out the Picts.
- ▷ The Romans brought roads, calendar, laws, concrete, aqueducts and central heating to Britain.

B.C. Before Christ - The period of time before Jesus was born.

A.D Anno Domini - In the year of our lord. Time period since Jesus has been born.

Empire A group of states or countries ruled by one leader

Democracy A country or community where every person gets a chance to vote on important decisions, including those who govern the country.

Republic A form of government where the people elect, or choose, their leaders.

Infrastructure Basic physical systems of a country's population, such as roads, water, sewage, utilities (electricity, gas). These systems are essential to allow everybody to be productive.

Architecture The design of buildings.

Rebellion A group of people who fight against a particular rule/decision made by the government.

Government The people who decide how things happen in a country.
