Know that...

Messiah means ‘a promised leader which is regarded as the saviour of a particular country, group, or cause’

Christians believe that Jesus is the Messiah and is important in the world today.

Christians believe that his birth, life, death and resurrection were part of a plan of God to restore the relationship between humans and God

Incarnation and the Messiah have a place within the ‘Big Story’ (frieze) of the Bible.

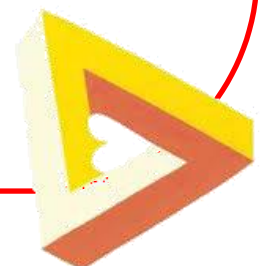
Gospel and prophecy texts use technical terms.

Connections can be made between biblical texts, Incarnation and Messiah using theological terms.

Christians put their beliefs about Jesus’ Incarnation into practice in different ways in celebrating important dates e.g. Christmas and Easter

Jesus was Jewish

Christians believe that Jesus is God in the flesh.





Key Vocabulary:

Messiah: the promised deliverer

Incarnation: a person who embodies in the flesh a deity, spirit, or quality

Saviour: a person who saves someone or something

Gospel: good news

Bible: the Christian Holy book that has the story and all of God's teachings.

Biblical: relating to or contained in the Bible

Prophecy: a prediction of what will happen in the future

Theological: the study of the nature of God and religious beliefs

Palm Sunday: the Sunday before Easter, on which Christ's entry into Jerusalem
