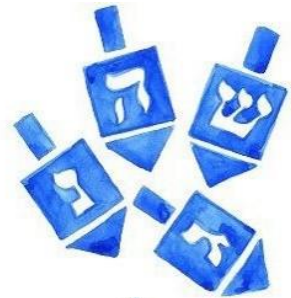
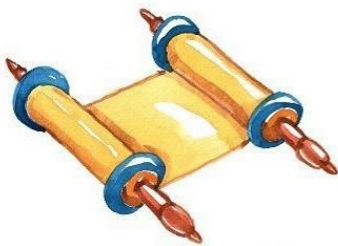

Key Knowledge:

To know that...

- Judaism is the stem of Christianity.
- Judaism is based on the teachings of the Torah Scrolls (which also form the teachings in the Old Testament in the Bible).
- The Jewish place of worship is a Synagogue and these differ according to denominations
- A Synagogue is a place of worship, community and learning and is run by a Rabbi.
- Jewish people celebrate the festival of Shabbat.
- There are special traditions and practices that happen during Shabbat.
- Some Jews follow Kosher food laws that are taken from the Torah Scroll teachings.
- A Bat/Bar Mitzvah celebration is held to recognise Jewish children becoming adults.

Key Vocabulary:

Judaism / Jews / Jewish - key names/terms for the religion.

Old Testament - the first half of the Christian Bible that is also found in the Jewish Torah Scroll. Torah Scroll - the Jewish text that contains holy teachings.

Synagogue - the place of worship for Jewish people.

Denominations - different branches / types of Judaism.

Rabbi— a Jewish religious leader, similar to a Vicar or Priest.

Worship - prayer, communication or giving thanks to God.

Traditions - special things that are done as part of the Jewish faith that have been done for thousands of years.

Shabbat - the Jewish festival that celebrates the day of rest.

Prayer—communication with God.

Kosher - allowed Parve = neutral Trayf = forbidden

Bat / Bar Mitzvah - a ceremony held by Jewish people to celebrate Jewish children going into adulthood.

Key People:

Moses—founder of the religion.
Stories about his life are also found in the Old Testament of the Bible.
