

What is the Pupil Premium?

You are receiving this leaflet because your child is eligible for Pupil Premium support.

The Pupil Premium is extra funding that the government gives to schools for each pupil considered to be 'disadvantaged'. Pupil Premium funding allows schools to target additional support for children and ensure that they do not fall behind their peers. How is Service Premium different?

The Service Premium is a separate grant for pupils who have a parent serving in the armed services. Unlike the Pupil Premium, this grant is not solely for raising attainment but for providing additional (mainly pastoral) support.

How do we spend Pupil Premium funding?

- Specialist staff time and resources to deliver additional interventions, such as small group Maths and English lessons.
- Conferencing with class teachers to address individual gaps in learning
- Professional development opportunities for staff and resources to provide high quality teaching and feedback.
- Targeted and specific pastoral care and emotional support to remove barriers to learning for pupils.
- Financial support for pupils to take part fully in extra-curricular opportunities, field trips, residential visits and music tuition.

Who is eligible for the Pupil Premium?

Primary school pupils who are eligible for Free School Meals, or have been eligible in the past 6 years.

Pupils currently or previously looked after by a local authority or other state care.

Did you know, children who receive Pupil Premium funding are entitled to:

Free School Meals

£50 to spend at PMG Schoolwear on Uniform

Discount on the Year 4 and 6 residential trips

£50 each year to spend on Kids Haven, school trips, after-school clubs or music tuition

Jimmy's Food Bank vouchers for monthly food parcels
