Going to Young Voices

Children go to a Young Voices concert with their school.

Travelling to the Arena

Schools travel together, often by coach or bus. Teachers and helpers are with the children.





Arriving

When schools arrive, the arena may be busy, with lots of children arriving at the same time. You may have to queue. Teachers and helpers at the arena will show the children where to go.

Finding Seats

Each school sits together in the choir seats. Children stay with their teachers and friends.



Rehearsal

Before the concert, there is a rehearsal with the whole Young Voices choir, made up of lots of schools.

Conductor

The conductor shows everyone what to do, and the band plays their music from the stage.





Other singers will join the choir and sing from the stage.

There will also be dancers, who will dance along to the Young Voices songs.

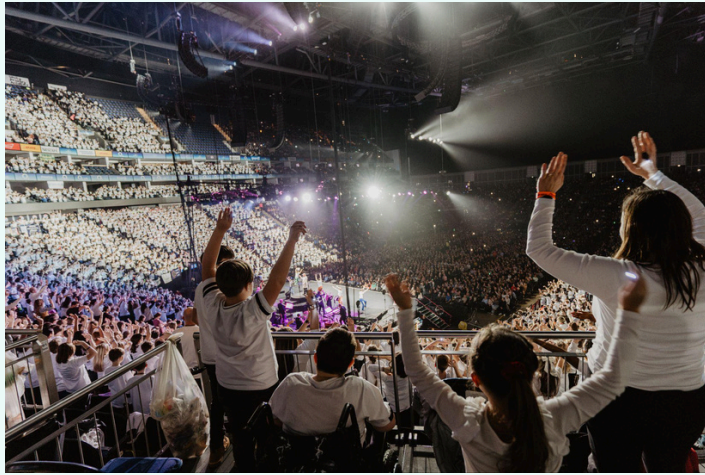


You can wear ear defenders if you want to.

Break Time

After rehearsal, children have time to eat food and drink water. Teachers tell them when it is break time, and when it is time to finish. Children bring their food as packed lunches with them, and eat in their choir seats.

When you go to the toilet, a teacher or helper will be with you and show you where to go.

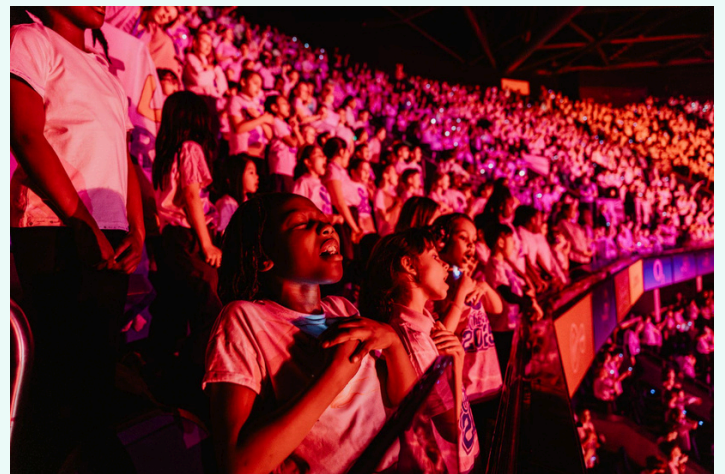


The Concert

When the concert starts, there are bright lights and loud music. This is part of the show. There is also an audience, made up of family and friends. As in your rehearsal, singers will be singing from the stage, and the band will be playing on stage too.

Singing

Children sing the songs they have learned at school.



Conductor

The choir sings together as one big group, and just like your rehearsal, the conductor at the front will be waving his arms and helping the choir to sing together.

Audience

The audience claps and cheers after the songs. Clapping shows that people are enjoying the music.



Going Home

When the concert ends, schools go back to the bus or coach, and make their way home to meet their families.
