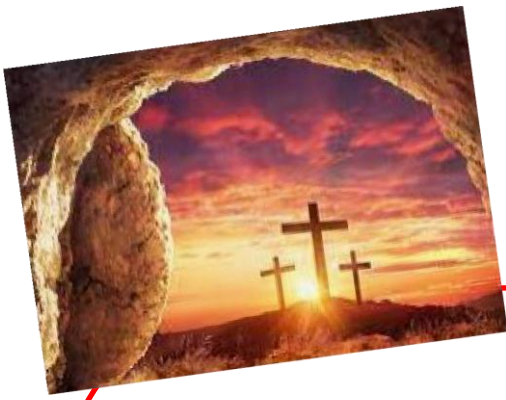
Key Knowledge:

To know that...

- **Christians believe that Jesus began the ‘Kingdom of God’**
- **Christians believe Jesus is still alive, and rules in their hearts and lives through the Holy Spirit.**
- **Christians believe that, after Jesus returned to Heaven, He sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to help people live in the Christian way.**

The Holy Spirit is the third part of the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - which is how Christians understand God, and is the means by which God is active on Earth.

Staying connected to Jesus means that the fruit of the Spirit can grow in the lives of Christians.



Key Vocabulary:

Sacrifice: a loss or something you give up, usually for the sake of a better cause.

Lent: The time of year when Christians prepare for Easter.

Shrove Tuesday: the Tuesday before Lent. A Christian festival.

Ash Wednesday: The first day of Lent.

Betrayal: an act of deliberate disloyalty or breaking someone's trust.

Denial: to say that something hasn't happened.

Resurrection: bringing someone back to life after they have died.

Holy Trinity: God represented in three special parts: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

God the Father: God in Heaven who created the Earth and everything in it.

God the Son: the physical being of Jesus, who was sent to Earth to save us and bring people closer to God.

God the Holy Spirit: God's powerful essence that is inside all of us and helps to connect us to God.
