Key Knowledge:

To know that:

The area of a block that receives no ink is called ‘recessed’

A block print will produce a mirror image on paper

One relief print can be used many times with different colours

Relief printing blocks can be used to make repeating patterns

There is a difference between positive and negative space and what it is.

Blocks can be built up from different textured materials to create a variety of effects

The engraved area of a print will produce the positive space on paper

Vocabulary

Relief — the part of the printing block that stands out—the part that receives the printing ink

Brayer/roller - a tool used to ensure the printing block receives the correct amount of ink

Relief printing ink — a particular, sticky type of ink that clings really well to the printing block

Recess - the part of the printing block that doesn't receive any ink

Print - a process where images are transferred from one material to another

Monochrome - artwork that only uses one colour

Pattern — a repeated, decorative design

Texture — the feel, appearance or consistency of a surface or substance

Negative space - the space around and between the subject of the image.

Positive space - the subject or object of the image
