

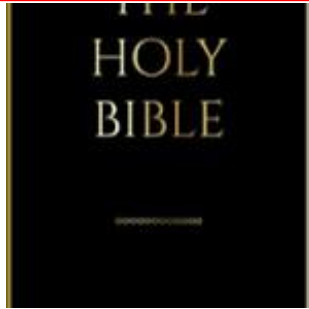

## Key Knowledge:

To know that:

**Symbols represent faiths from around the world and have special meanings.**

**Religious artefacts such as the cross are powerful symbols for Christians today.**

**People use symbols to connect with their own faith.**

⇒ Symbols are usually objects, which are easy to understand, but they represent something more complex

People wear or display symbols to show others what they believe in.

Symbols can connect people of the same or similar faiths.

Key Vocabulary:

**Artefacts** - a man-made object, such as pieces of art or tools, that is of particular cultural, historical or archaeological interest.

**Sign** - something you see (or hear) which means something. A sign may be natural or man-made.

**Stained glass window** - a window made of coloured glass, often showing religious pictures and usually seen in churches.

**Symbolism** - the use of symbols to represent deeper meanings or themes.

**Symbols** - usually objects which are easy to understand, but they represent something more complex.
