# Eco-Warriors



## *Waste Not Want Not Visit*

The school's Eco Warriors recently enjoyed an inspiring and eye-opening visit to Poole Waste Not Want Not, a community initiative dedicated to supporting low-income families by providing affordable food, budgeting skills and social activities as well as reducing food waste while supporting local families.

During their visit, the children were given a guided tour of the shop, where they learned how surplus food is collected, sorted, and made available at affordable prices. They were fascinated to discover how the organisation ensures that nothing goes to waste. Any excess or out-of-date food that is no longer suitable for human consumption is collected by local farmers and repurposed, meaning that every donation is used responsibly.

The Eco Warriors asked thoughtful and insightful questions throughout the visit, demonstrating their growing understanding of sustainability and environmental responsibility. They were particularly inspired by how the project brings together the community to tackle waste in practical and creative ways - something that strongly reflects our school's Eco Code.

One highlight of the visit was learning about the incredible plastic bottle top initiative. Members of the project collected an astonishing 85,000 bottle tops, which were then transformed into a bench - an excellent example of how everyday waste can be repurposed into something meaningful and long-lasting.

The children also had a hands-on experience, taking on the role of shop volunteers. They helped to price donated items and stock them on the shelves, gaining a real appreciation for the effort involved in running such an important community resource.

Overall, the visit was both educational and inspiring. The Eco Warriors returned to school full of ideas about how they can continue to make a positive difference, reinforcing their commitment to caring for the environment and supporting sustainable practices within our community.

# Year 5 Wonderstruck!

On Friday 8 May, we were once again lucky enough to enjoy the explosive Wonderstruck workshop, which complemented our Forces learning in Science. Peter, who led the day, thrilled us with incredible demonstrations of rockets, jet engines and exploding gases - we were witness to such loud explosions that we could even 'feel' the sound and heat hitting our chests!

We couldn't believe our eyes as Peter laid out on a bed of nails, teaching us all about the concept of spreading weight across surface area and he then showed us the effects of gunpowder exploding in a bowl of Rice Crispies (other types of rice based cereal would also work!)

In the afternoon, we got to make our own rockets, experiencing upthrust in action. We worked in small teams to design and build simple card and paper rockets. The best bit was getting to launch them from Peter's specially built compressed air rocket launchers. They went all the way across the school field!

We are also ensuring leaders have more time to focus on teaching quality and pupil outcomes, while staff continue to receive training to support consistent assessment and strong preparation for national tests.

This ongoing collaboration ensures your children benefit from high-quality teaching, accurate assessment, and the very best support to succeed.

We always see a drop off in attendance in the weeks immediately preceding and immediately following a break. These are key weeks and absence during such times will inevitably leave gaps in a child's knowledge as well as missed opportunities for enrichment.

Congratulations to the children of Year Four who are currently our highest attenders with 96.5%. That said, all year groups are over 96% which puts us in the top fifth nationally.

# WELLBEING

## Mental Health Awareness Week – 11-17 May 2026

The theme for this year's Mental Health Awareness Week was ACTION.

In a whole school assembly, we looked at how taking action is an extension of showing awareness of mental health and wellbeing. We thought about how we can take action for ourselves and for others by using the five steps to well being (keeping active, taking notice, giving, keeping learning and connecting) and how this affects the wider world. We reflected about how every small, positive action contributes to the greater good of everyone and what this might look like for them. Needless to say, our children contributed some excellent and thought-provoking ideas.



## Transition At BPS

As the second half of the Summer Term approaches in any school, we are mindful of all the change that is coming your child's way. Some children will just breeze through this, barely noticing a thing, whereas, for others, it will be an anxious time. Here at BPS, we endeavour to support all our children as much as possible through these changes. As always, we will have our Transfer Day where children will spend a day with their new classes and new teachers. As in previous years, we will share your child's new class with them the afternoon before, along with pictures of their new teacher and other teachers in the year group.

On Transfer Day itself, teachers will give each child the opportunity to share information about themselves which may affect their transition to a new class: for example, one year, a child mentioned that they loved hats and so their teacher specifically chose to wear a hat in September when they went out to meet the class; another time, a child mentioned that they preferred sitting near the door and this was taken into consideration when the seating plan was done for September.

In addition, for those children transferring from Year Six, secondary school staff will be visiting the school. There are also some new documents on the [school website](#) for both parents and children to access under the label 'Year 6 to Secondary Transition'.

If child needs some particular support with transition, there is a program called Stormbreak Shine which can be done at home with your child. If this is something you wish to access, please contact the school office in the first instance.

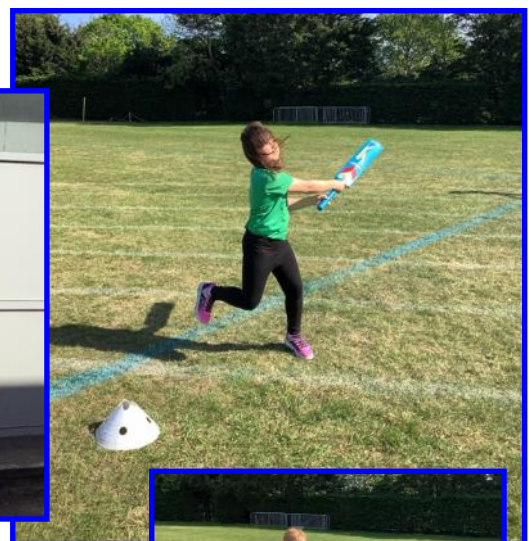


## TAG RUGBY
